We also had a great turnout for our Parent/Teacher Interviews. If you have any questions about how your child is doing, please e-mail their teacher for an up-date.



sound, or movement as the proceeding person made, and then adds their own performance. They then choose the next person, and this person need only repeat the preceding action and add one before choosing someone new.

PALS
